## FAQ1 : How much money does school receive from Pupil Premium Funding?

A; £600 per pupil eligible for FSM. For the period April 2011-April 2012 this totalled £16,104. (27 pupils)

For the period April 2012-April 2013 this totals £26,400 (44 pupils)

#### FAQ2: How is this money used?

A; We use the money from April 2011- present day to provide many reading, writing, maths intervention groups for these pupils. Across the school, pupils who receive pupil premium funding are given smaller, more focused teaching on their specific learning needs in different curriculum areas.

We have also provided Extra Curricular activities for targeted pupils in receipt of FSM.
